THINGS TO KNOW AS A CATHOLIC

(Continued from last week)

11.WHY IS THERE A COLLECTION (OFFERING) AT MASS?

The custom of sending a plate round after the General Intercessions (Prayer of the faithful) at Mass to collect the monetary contributions of the faithful is not just for the purpose of obtaining funds for the expenses of the clergy. Its origin comes from very spiritual motions.

In the early church, after the prayer of the faithful, bread and wine were brought to the altar, these were the elements used by Christ when he instituted the Holy Eucharist. These were offered to God as elements to be set apart for the sacrifice, in keeping with the general practice of dedicating to God what was used for his service.

Bread and wine as a staple food, symbolized life. The offering of bread and wine was thus a symbolic way by which those assisting at Mass made an offering of themselves with Christ offered in the Eucharistic Sacrifice. After the 10th century, the practice of offering bread and wine by the people gradually ceased. St. Peter Damian of the 11th Century (1007 – 1072) expressly mentioned that people gave money instead of bread and wine. The symbolism however remained the same. It was obviously because bringing bread and wine to church was impractical and cumbersome that it was given up and replaced by the more convenient offering of money.

It should be remembered however that the collection of contributions of money at Mass replaces and represents the former offering of bread and wine which had a deep spiritual meaning.
